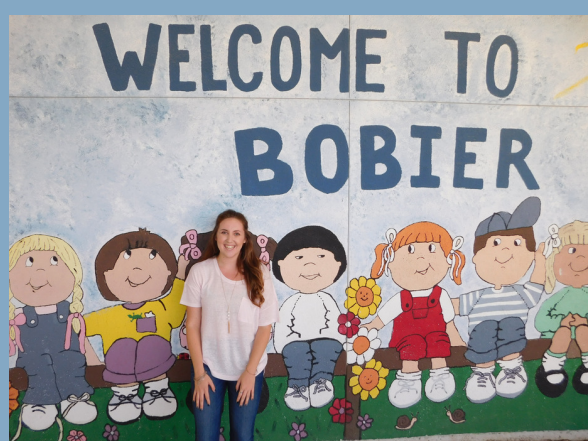


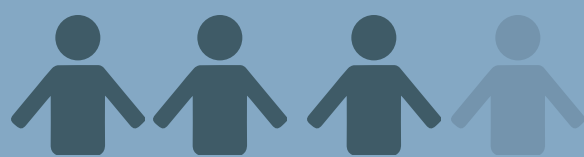
ME IN TODAY'S EDUCATIONAL CONTEXT



I, a white, upper-middle income female, currently teach preschool at Bobier Elementary School in Vista, CA .

Bobier's demographics:

- 93% Hispanic/Latino student body
- 95% on free and reduced lunch
- 65% English Language Learners



3 out of 4 school-age children in California are non-white, leading to rising diversity in the classroom (Spring, 2016, p.143).



However, almost 75% of California's teachers are white, leading to cultural clashes between the student body and teaching staff (Spring, 2016, p.169).
